You will be invited in to our Get NCD Ready event at the end of June.



Accept your place

You can accept your place when you meet with our teaching staff, or you can accept it later over the phone or via email.



Meet your tutor

We'll send you an appointment to come for a chat with your course tutor where you'll receive advice and guidance.

Following GCSE results day, you will be invited into college. You will have a chance to select your three A-Level subjects.

A-LEVEL SUBJECTS

Art & Design

Develop your knowledge, understanding and skills in a range of specialist areas as you explore the specialism of Fine Art.

Biology

You will study biology and disease, the variety of living organisms, practical and investigative skills, populations & environment, and control in cells & organisms.

Business

You will develop a broad understanding of how businesses work by exploring core business concepts and applying them to business contexts.

Chemistry

Chemistry at this level attempts to explain why processes happen, working out the reasons for chemical changes and the trends and patterns in these changes.

Classical Civilisation

This course allows you to look at many aspects of the classical world which are significant in the development of the modern world.

English Language

Develop your knowledge and interest in the English language and improve your use of English in a variety of contexts.

English Literature

This challenging and enjoyable course is for those who love reading and want to study a range of poetry, drama and prose.

Film Studies

Discover the ways different genres of film encode meaning for their audience by studying cinematography, editing, sound and mise en scene.

Further Mathematics*

This course expands the areas covered in AS/A-Level Mathematics and introduces new topics such as matrices, complex numbers and more.

Geography

Develop an in-depth understanding of physical and human geography and explore the complexity of people and the environment.

History

You will make links and draw comparisons between different periods of the past and develop an understanding of history's intrinsic value and significance.

Law

This subject will provide you with an understanding of the English legal system with a focus on criminal law, contract law and human rights.

Mathematics

You will learn to recognise how real life situations may be represented mathematically and acquire the skills required to use technology to solve mathematical problems.

PE

This course will equip you with knowledge, understanding and skills relating to scientific, socio-cultural and practical aspects of physical education. Assessment includes exams and a non-exam assessment.

Physics

If you enjoy problem solving, handling numbers and theories and like a challenge then this course is for you. Much of the work is covered by experiments and demonstrations.

Politics

You will study the political process in the UK as well as its democratic and political institutions and have the opportunity to engage in political debates and discuss a range of relevant issues.

Psychology

Gain an insight into the world of psychology through practical research and prime psychological studies. You will study topics such as social influence, memory and attachment.

Religious Studies

Investigate ultimate questions such as 'why does evil exist?' and 'what is the purpose of life?' while studying topics that explain the diversity of life and religion in the modern world.

Sociology

Explore the social influences that shape people's lives. You will look at different methods of research and examine particular aspects of social life in more detail.

SIXTH FORM CENTRE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

To study A-Levels with us you will need a minimum of 5 GCSEs which must include maths at grade 4 or above & English at grade 5 or above.

Some A-Level subjects have their own specific entry criteria – see our website for details.

ADDITIONAL SIXTH FORM CENTRE SUBJECTS*

Level 3 Diploma Applied Science

This applied science course is interactive and will include numerous excursions, practical sessions and assignments.

Level 3 Diploma Criminology

This course will give you an introduction to criminological theories to give you a greater insight into the kind of thinking used by experts to explain crimes.

Level 3 Extended Project Qualification

This is an additional skills based subject that will provide you with transferable skills in order to approach tasks in other A-Level subject with confidence. You will write a report, keep a diary and give a presentation.
